ANNUAL TOWN MEETING - April 21, 2020

The Town of Westport Annual Meeting was called to order by Town Chair Dean Grosskopf on Tuesday, April 21, 2020, by FreeTeleconference.com due to the COVID-19 pandemic and declared State of Emergency, at 7:02 p.m. Also attending were: John Cuccia, Terry Enge, Ken Sipsma, Susan Stolen, Mitchell Trotter, Mark Trotter, Deputy Clerk-Treasurer Bob Anderson (also a resident elector), and Attorney/Administrator/Clerk-Treasurer Tom Wilson.

The minutes of the 2019 Annual Meeting were approved as presented on a motion by Ken Sipsma, second John Cuccia, 8-0.

A written statement of the Town's financial condition for 2019 including revenues, expenditures and current indebtedness, was presented by Bob Anderson, in the form of the available draft 2019 financial audit, and shows the Town to be in excellent financial health. Mr. Anderson then answered general questions from those in attendance, and commented on the fine financial health of the utilities and on investigating the use of sweep accounts to protect higher year end funds. Dean Grosskopf commented that he agrees with the draft report. Mr. Sipsma thanked staff for doing such a fine job with the Town finances.

# A RESOLUTION BY THE TOWN MEETING OF THE TOWN OF WESTPORT, DANE COUNTY, WISCONSIN, REGARDING PAYING ELECTED OFFICERS SERVING AS TOWN EMPLOYEES

The Town Meeting of the Town of Westport, Dane County, Wisconsin, hereby resolves as follows regarding paying elected officers serving as Town employees:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 60.37(4), Wis. Stats., the Town Meeting is to establish the hourly wage to be paid to an elected town officer serving as a town employee, and that amount shall not exceed \$15,000 each year; and,

WHEREAS, the Town Board by motion submitted this Resolution to the Town Meeting for consideration, and the Town Meeting finds that it is reasonable and acceptable to employ Town of Westport officers for some positions as may be needed by the Town based on experience, skills, and availability.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Town Meeting of the Town of Westport held on April\_\_\_, 2021, that it is acceptable for the Town of Westport to hire Westport Town Officers based on their skills, experience, and availability, as Town employees, and those employees shall be paid no more than \$25 per hour, with the actual rate of hourly pay to be determined in the discretion of the Town Administrator, but such officers shall not be paid more than \$15,000 each year as an employee, exclusive of their pay as a Town Officer.

This Resolution shall take effect upon passage and proper posting, and shall remain in effect until cancelled or amended by the Town Meeting.

### Re: Resolution to allow employment of elected officials

The Town of Westport must keep a very clear line between elected officials and paid staff to avoid any appearance of conflict of interest.

I have worked with boards for more than 30 years, and both Paul and I have served as board members for other organizations. In all cases, it was imperative—for ethical purposes and to avoid conflict of interest—to keep a well-defined separation of duties between elected officials and paid staff.

Boards are responsible for setting vision, direction, and policies. Staff are responsible for establishing procedures to carry them out.

If the town needs "very limited-term, temporary type of work," as noted by Administrator Tom Wilson in the *Waunakee Tribune*, then that's a function to be performed by paid staff (or area temporary-help agencies), not by board members.

We appreciate the Town Board's efforts on the part of constituents and the creative thinking in trying to resolve unexpected issues. However, a resolution to hire elected officials—regardless of how temporarily—doesn't pass the smell test on multiple levels, including potential conflict of interest.
